## FUND AIM

The objective of this fund is to provide an income in excess of the yield represented by the performance of the FTSE All-Share Index, and long-term growth. The fund will typically invest between 80% and 100% in UK company shares, or in shares of overseas companies which have a significant part of their activities in the UK or whose shares are traded on UK stock markets.

## RISK AND REWARD PROFILE

## FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Following a decline in November, the FTSE All Share rebounded in December and ended the month up 4.8%. This led the index to close the year at an all-time high, with performance driven by mega caps and returns from commodity sectors.

After a weak start to the year, oil finished as the biggest monthly outperformer in December. Copper prices rose to a four-year peak as supply disruptions from Chile – the world’s largest supplier – and strong demand in China pushed markets higher. In terms of headlines, the passing of tax reform in the US was a key event, with focus on lifting growth and wages. By far the biggest impact of the tax reform bill is the corporate tax cut to 21%, which in the near term represents a net positive for US corporate earnings and cashflows.

Among sectors, mining stocks considerably outperformed. Some cyclical stocks rose higher on the back of optimism over proposed tax reforms in the US. There were also positive contributions from REITs, travel & leisure, and house goods & construction companies. Utilities was the only sector in negative territory, while aerospace & defence and support service industries also underperformed. From a style perspective, cheap and value stocks were out of favour in December.

The fund underperformed the index in the period, with disappointing stock selection weighing on returns. Sector positioning also proved negative, primarily due to our underweight exposure to basic materials and overweight in technology.
