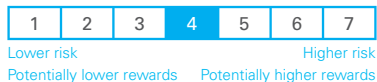

The fund aims to provide investors with a return in line with the Euro government bond market, as represented by the Bloomberg Barclays Euro Treasury Index.

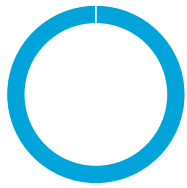

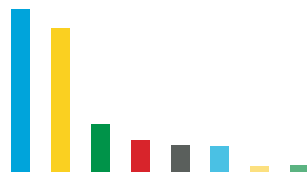

INDEX FUND MANAGEMENT TEAM

The Index Fund Management team comprises 25 fund managers, supported by two analysts. Management oversight is provided by the Global Head of Index Funds. The team has average industry experience of 15 years, of which seven years has been at LGIM, and is focused on achieving the equally important objectives of close tracking and maximising returns.

KEY RISKS
