FUND AIM

The objective of this fund is to provide income, with some potential for growth. The fund will invest in a broad spread of company shares from all economic sectors. The company shares the fund invests in will be from Asia (excluding Japan), the rest of the Pacific region and Australasia.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

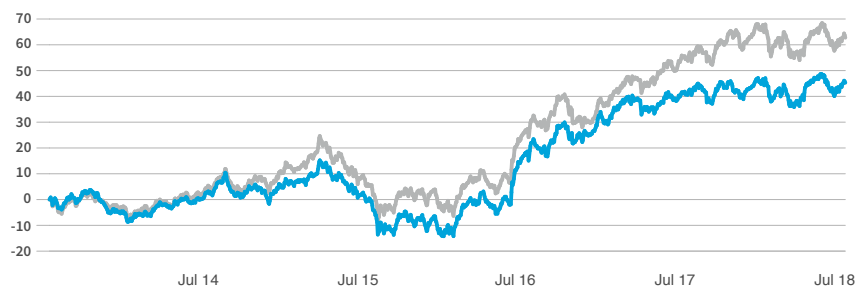

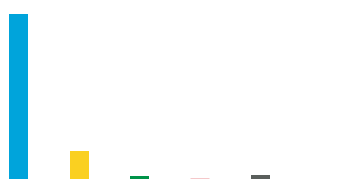

FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Asia Pacific ex Japan equities experienced a better month in July, rising 2%. However, year to date returns remain negative. China missed out on the recovery, falling 1.6%, as investors continued to worry about trade frictions. The falls were particularly severe for some of the Chinese internet names. Hong Kong also underperformed, as better performance among Hong Kong property companies was offset by falls in HK listed Chinese consumer stocks. Australia outperformed the broader region, rising 2.9%, as banks rallied on concerns easing around the banking royal commission.

South Korea fell, with the bulk of the decline from currency weakness. Taiwan had a strong month, rising 6.6%, as semiconductor names performed well and some of the Apple supply chain names that were sold off earlier this year further recovered. India also had a strong month, rising 7% as index heavyweight Reliance rerated and the Goods and Services Tax was cut for a number of products. ASEAN had a good month with Thailand and the Philippines up strongly, bouncing after steep sell-offs earlier this year.

The fund enjoyed another solid month, increasing its outperformance of the wider peer group return. At a country level, we saw positive contributions from both Australia and China, while our underweight in Korea (and stock selection) also added value. On the flipside, India stock selection disappointed (Coal India and Bharti Infratel), while our Macau names were a small negative.

Paul joined LGIM in 2006 and is lead Fund Manager for the Asian Income portfolios. He began his investment career in 1991 at Phillips and Drew Fund Management, now called UBS Global Asset Management, and developed broad experience across UK, Europe, Japan and, predominantly, Asia ex Japan, over subsequent years. At LGIM Paul launched the Legal & General Asian Income Trust and in 2013 formed the Global Income Team, which forms the core of the firm's equity income expertise. He read Engineering, Economics and Management at Lincoln College, Oxford University and is an Associate of the Society of Investment Professionals.
