

FUND AIM

The objective of the Fund is to provide income and growth above those of the FTSE World Europe ex-UK TR Net Index (the "Benchmark Index"). The Fund aims to outperform the Benchmark Index by 2% per annum. This objective is before the deduction of any charges and measured over rolling three year periods.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

The fund is in category 5 because it invests in company shares which are sensitive to variations in the stock market. The value of company shares can change substantially over short periods of time.



FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

The aggressive sell-off for risk assets in March resulted in heavy falls for equity markets. We've seen global demand collapse and supply shock, which drove a 10-day halving of oil prices. Early investor concern on potential supply chain, earnings and multiple risk has since given way to a focus on balance sheet health and liquidity. Through the month, we saw an increasing number of corporates cutting dividends, reducing capex and suspending buybacks amid a growing cash preservation stance.

Turning to equity market performance, all sectors reported varying degrees of negative returns in the period as equities de-rated sharply. As we approach the Q1 earnings season we appear set for downgrades, given still high expectations from analysts, however we think these are widely anticipated by investors. In Europe, Healthcare, Consumer Goods and Technology sectors were relative outperformers. Cyclical and rate-sensitive sectors were the laggards. Utilities also underperformed. At the factor level, Value lagged Quality and Growth styles.

The L&G European Equity Income fund delivered a negative return of -17.5%. Stock selection and sector allocation were both negative in the period. Selection weakness in Consumer Goods and Resources was the biggest detriment to performance. The overweight allocation to Financials was also unhelpful as Banks sold-off sharply. By company, the largest underperformers were PGS, Societe Generale, SES, ING and BNP Paribas. We saw positive contributions from Flow Traders and Novo Nordisk. On activity, we introduced new positions in Mowi, Siemens and Bayer. We sold out of Schneider Electric, SKF and Zurich Insurance.

Andrew joined LGIM in August 2014 and is a Fund Manager in the Global Income team. He joined from the in-house pension scheme at BAE Systems, where he was head of the European equities team, and a member of the asset allocation committee. Previously, he managed European equities for institutional and retail funds at Henderson Global Investors and HSBC Asset Management. He started his career at Phillips & Drew in 1992, where he spent 10 years investing in UK, European and Japanese Equities. He has an MA in PPE from New College, Oxford. Andrew is a CFA charterholder (since 1998) and an ASIP.
