

FUND CHARACTERISTICS

The fund employs an index tracking strategy, aiming to replicate the performance of its benchmark. The index aims to reduce carbon intensity by 70% relative to the starting universe at the outset and on a path to achieve net zero by 2050 and fossil fuel exposure whilst improving green revenues and delivering dynamic de-carbonisation As part of LGIM's commitment to address climate change, companies that fail to meet LGIM's minimum standards in low carbon transition and corporate governance standards may be excluded from the fund, as a result the fund may not hold all of the constituents of the

We follow a pragmatic approach to managing index funds, either investing directly in the securities of that index, or indirectly through other LGIM funds. The fund may also hold index and single stock futures for efficient portfolio management.

INDEX FUND MANAGEMENTTEAM

The Index Fund Management team comprises 25 fund managers, supported by two analysts. Management oversight

is provided by the Global Head of Index Funds. The team has average industry experience of 15 years, of which seven years has been at LGIM, and is focused on achieving the equally important objectives of close tracking and maximising returns.
