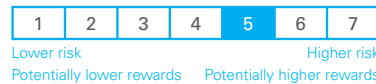

FUND AIM

The objective of this fund is to provide growth. The fund will typically invest between 80% and 100% in UK company shares. The fund may also invest in company shares from Europe on an ancillary basis. The fund will invest in companies considered, in the manager's view, to be undervalued by the market.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

The fund is in category 5 because it invests in company shares which are sensitive to variations in the stock market. The value of company shares can change substantially over short periods of time.

- Legal & General has a significant presence in the UK stock market so our fund managers often have the chance to meet a company's management team before we invest

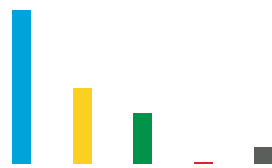

FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Following a strong first quarter for risk assets, equity markets extended their recovery in April. Aside from better data indicators from the US and recent signs of stabilisation in Chinese economic data, the most encouraging development in the past month is how sluggish economic activity readings now appear to be discounted by investors.

Seemingly, investor assumptions imply many of the global economic events will be resolved favourably. However, it's likely that the onus falls on corporate earnings to have a determining impact on price momentum going forwards. Thus far, subdued expectations have broadly been exceeded in the US and Europe.

Turning to UK equity market performance, sector leadership was mainly with industrials, financials and consumer cyclicals. This reflected ebbing concerns about the global economic outlook. Healthcare, utilities and resources were this month's laggards. UK mid-caps were the strongest size group.

For the fund, we are pleased to report a strong performance, with the portfolio up 4.2% in April. This was driven by a combination of positive stock selection- from oil & gas and industrials- and sector positioning, where our underweight in healthcare and utilities added value. Leading contributors included Melrose, St James's Place, Ferguson, Draper Esprit, Energean and Blue Prism. Not owning AstraZeneca and British American Tobacco also proved helpful. Saga and Micro Focus were the main noteworthy detractors.

For activity, we initiated new positions in Intermediate Capital and Standard Chartered. Countryside Properties and Ophir Energy were sold.
