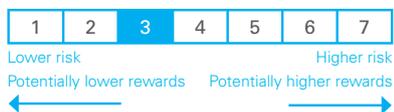


WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

FUND CHARACTERISTICS

The fund may achieve all or a significant amount of its exposure by purchasing shares in the LGIM Global Corporate Bond Fund which is a UCITS Compliant OEIC sub-fund. The underlying fund will principally invest in a variety of fixed, floating, index linked and zero coupon government bonds and corporate bonds, other fixed or floating debt securities that may include Asset-Backed Securities (ABS), hybrid bonds, shares in the sub-funds of LGIM Liquidity Funds Plc. and other cash and money market instruments. Currency hedging is employed by way of purchasing units in the GBP hedged share class of the fund.






FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Performance was positive, driven by asset allocation, credit selection and rates strategies. We didn't have a clear view of the US election outcome and its impact on markets, and so didn't take strong positions based on this, but had positioned the portfolios for positive vaccine news, which was, in the event, very positive.

Our outlook on credit markets became more constructive at the beginning of Q4, following a moderate sell-off at the end of Q3. We therefore increased credit risk to an overweight position throughout the quarter, preferring emerging market debt and high yield over developed market investment grade, given the attractiveness of valuations.

This was beneficial as credit markets posted positive excess returns in Q4, and emerging market debt and high yield outperformed developed market investment grade debt.

Credit alpha was positive, driven by compression themes that we maintained through the quarter. Our preference for long-dated, Covid-exposed names in retail real estate and BBB-rated cyclical names, such as General Motors, General Electric and Boeing, over higher rated, more expensive areas of the credit market, was beneficial to the fund as compression in spreads was strong amidst positive market sentiment. We enhanced exposure to European peripheral sub-financials, which have continued to benefit from the EU Recovery Fund and credit-friendly M&A.

Our rates strategies made a positive contribution, driven by long positions in Australia and in long-dated EU bonds, and our preference in short-dated rates for US over European rates.
