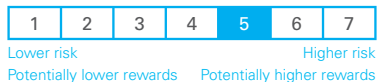

FUND AIM

The objective of this fund is to provide growth. The fund will typically invest between 80% and 100% in UK company shares. The fund may also invest in company shares from Europe. The fund will invest in companies considered, in the manager's view, to be undervalued by the market.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

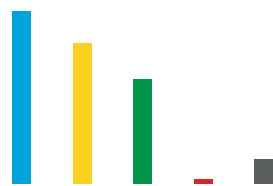

FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Equity markets performed better in November, though investors remain relatively risk averse. Corporate newsflow began to recede following Q3 earnings, meaning that market direction was once more in the hands of top-down drivers. Global growth indicators continue to imply an economic slowdown, while the response to comments from a less hawkish Fed and the Bank of England's post-Brexit scenarios were met with a degree of caution. UK equity markets continue to be out of favour, falling -1.6% in total returns. Mid-caps underperformed, while low beta names found support. In terms of sectors, we saw telecoms and healthcare top the winners list. On the flipside, resources and capital goods industries fared poorly.

Turning to performance, the L&G Special Situations fund fell 4.1% in the period, which we consider deeply disappointing. Stock selection was a considerable detriment, driven by our exposure to mid and small caps, alongside returns in consumer services, resources and technology sectors. Sector allocation was broadly neutral. In respect of individual performers, GVC Holdings, IQE, Ophir Energy and Energean Oil & Gas were the biggest detractors. For GVC, analysts lowered estimates to account for recent UK regulatory decisions, which impact 2019 earnings. The company also announced the acquisition of Australian digital sportsbetting group, highlighting the strength of its strategy. Energy names were weak due to the correlation with oil prices, which continues to experience substantial price declines on supply/demand fears. Stand-out positives were leisure names Wizz Air and Carnival.

On activity, there was no significant trading in the period.

Gavin joined LGIM in 2007 and has been the Fund Manager for the UK Special Situations Trust since January 2018. Previously, he was a Global Equities Analyst at BlueBay Asset Management. Gavin spent the majority of his buy-side career as a Portfolio Manager with UBS O'Connor. Prior to this, he was a top-rated, sell-side analyst covering the Autos, Capital Goods and Conglomerates sectors at investment banks including SG Warburg (now part of UBS) and Goldman Sachs. Gavin holds a degree in Philosophy and Economics from University College, London.
