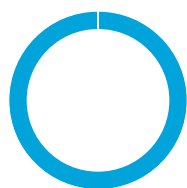

FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Emerging market debt remained well supported in January amid continuing inflows into the asset class despite higher US treasury yields (10-year yields rose about 30bps in January) and a steepening in the yield curve. Over the month the EMBIG Diversified sovereign index returned -0.04% (with spreads tightening by 21bps) and the CEMBI Broad Diversified corporate index returned 0.05% (with spreads tightening by 25bps).

The fund delivered positive returns, with relative performance helped by our bond selection on a regional basis, despite our overweight in sovereign bonds versus corporate bonds. Our overweight positions in Argentina and Brazil were the main positive contributors to the relative performance of the fund. In Argentina, our overweight position in provinces contributed particularly positively while in Brazil our tactical overweight in corporate bonds also worked out well. In addition, overweight positions in sovereign bonds of Angola and Ghana contributed positively.



UDAY PATNAIK

Uday is responsible for developing LGIM's emerging market capabilities within the Multi-Strategy Fixed Income team. Uday joined LGIM in April 2014 from Gulf International Bank (UK) Ltd where he held the title of Chief Investment Officer with primary responsibility for managing the flagship EMD hedge fund and other fixed income portfolios. Uday has an MBA in finance from the University of Chicago and a BSc degree in industrial management from Carnegie Mellon University.

KEY RISKS

- This fund holds bonds that, rather than being traded on an exchange, are traded through agents, brokers or investment banks matching buyers and sellers. This makes the bonds less easy to buy and sell than investments that are traded on an exchange and on any particular day there may not be a buyer or a seller for the bonds. Investment returns on bonds are sensitive to trends in interest rate movements. Their values are likely to fall when interest rates rise. Such falls may be more pronounced in a low interest rate environment. Bonds with a short time to go before their maturity date will fall by less than bonds with a longer time to their maturity date.
