### FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Following a mixed September, global equity markets enjoyed a strong start to Q4. The FTSE All Share was back in positive territory, closing the month up 1.9% and taking the year-to-date gain to 9.8%.

Looking at the top-down macro environment, news from the domestic consumer-facing areas remains mixed, reflecting company-specific exposure and patchy consumption. While this may provide fuel for pessimists, economic data looks broadly fine.

In the UK, mid-caps were once again the size winners. Of the sectors, technology and energy outperformed. Conversely, utilities and pharmaceutical sectors underperformed. Meanwhile, both retail sectors were also a drag. From a style perspective, cheap stocks were out of favour, with value measures yet again under pressure. In terms of geographic exposure, domestic-exposed companies reversed last month's trend, closing the period in negative territory. This was to the benefit of those exposed to North America, which has seen renewed bullish expectations on possible tax reform

We are pleased to report that the L&G Growth Trust delivered a gain of 2.8%, surpassing the benchmark and peer group median return. Stock selection in industrials, technology and consumer goods made a significant positive contribution to performance. Meanwhile, returns in consumer discretionary was more mixed. At a sector level, our underweight in healthcare and utilities added value. This was offset by our underweight in energy, which proved unhelpful on the back of the bounce in the oil price and better numbers from BP.

Prior to this, he was a top-rated, sell-side analyst covering the Autos, Capital Goods and Conglomerates sectors at investment banks including SG Warburg (now part of UBS) and Goldman Sachs. Gavin holds a degree in Philosophy and Economics from University College, London.
