



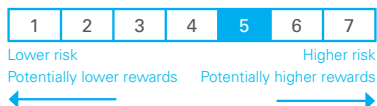
# Legal & General Asian Income Trust

## FUND AIM

The objective of this fund is to provide income, with some potential for growth. The fund will invest in a broad spread of company shares from all economic sectors. The company shares the fund invests in will be from Asia (excluding Japan), the rest of the Pacific region and Australasia.

## RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

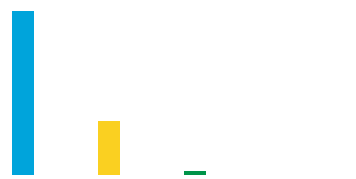

## FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Asia Pacific ex Japan equities were not spared from the global selloff in February, falling 1.6% over the month. At a country level, Korea and China were the worst performers, both down 3.8%. This was led by sharp falls in Samsung Electronics and Tencent. There were also significant sell-offs in the Chinese cyclicals, particularly in property and insurers, as the state-backed funds held back from providing support to the market. India also performed poorly, falling 3.2% as investors digested the impact of a large scale fraud at a state owned bank.

Taiwan performed better than the broader region, gaining 0.2%, as the Apple supply chain fared better than other technology names given they had already been sold off after the launch of the iPhone X. Australia was also a relative outperformer, falling 0.4%, as it had not participated in the global rally in January. ASEAN also performed relatively well given the region lagged the market in 2017. Elsewhere, it was a better month for Hong Kong and Singapore.

In respect of performance, the net midday return of L&G Asian Income fund was broadly in line with the index of -1.6%. However, this represented good outperformance relative to the peer group. Looking at attribution drivers, country allocation was a big positive, led by our overweight in Australia. Meanwhile, we also saw good stock selection in India. Conversely, our China and New Zealand exposure disappointed.

He began his investment career in 1991 at Phillips and Drew Fund Management, now called UBS Global Asset Management, and developed broad experience across UK, Europe, Japan and, predominantly, Asia ex Japan, over subsequent years. At LGIM Paul launched the Legal & General Asian Income Trust and in 2013 formed the Global Income Team, which forms the core of the firm's equity income expertise. He read Engineering, Economics and Management at Lincoln College, Oxford University and is an Associate of the Society of Investment Professionals.
