FUND AIM

The objective of this Fund is to provide income by tracking the performance of the JPMorgan Emerging Markets Bond Index Plus, (the "Index"). This objective is after the deduction of charges and taxation.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE

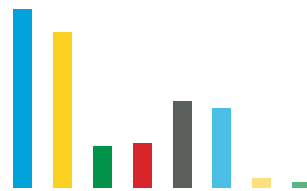

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INDEX TRACKING

The team believes that successful index tracking strikes a balance between close matching of the index and the management of trading costs. Using pragmatic replication, all the bonds in the portfolio are held broadly in line with their index weights, ensuring close tracking of the index.

The tracking error figures shown are annualised and are calculated using gross of fee returns based on LGIM's internally calculated valuations. The gross of fee performance figures are calculated on a total return basis and have been adjusted to exclude the impact of uninvested cash balances within the income and revenue account. The gross performance numbers are an indication of fund manager skill and are not reflective of true fund performance. True fund performance priced at official valuation points are calculated by Lipper and available above. Please note that on occasion, difference in the treatment of withholding tax between fund and benchmark can be significant and lead to the appearance of heightened relative returns on overseas equity funds. The fund launched on 11 December 2012.

INDEX FUND MANAGEMENT TEAM

The Index Fund Management team comprises 25 fund managers, supported by two analysts. Management oversight is provided by the Global Head of Index Funds. The team has average industry experience of 15 years, of which seven years has been at LGIM, and is focused on achieving the equally important objectives of close tracking and maximising returns.

KEY RISKS
