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

FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Equity markets performed better in November, though investors remain relatively risk averse. Corporate newsflow began to recede following Q3 earnings, meaning market direction was once more in the hands of top-down drivers. Global growth indicators continue to imply an economic slowdown, while the response to comments from a less hawkish Fed and the Bank of England's post-Brexit scenarios were met with a degree of caution. UK equity markets continue to be out of favour, falling-1.6% in total returns. Midcaps underperformed, while low beta names found support. In terms of sectors, we saw telecoms and healthcare top the winners list. Resources and capital goods industries fared poorly.

Turning to performance, the L&G UK Select fund fell 3.2% in the period, which we consider disappointing. Stock selection was a considerable detriment, driven by our exposure in consumer services and technology sectors. Sector allocation was broadly neutral. In respect of individual performers, Sophos Group, B&M Value Retail, Royal Bank of Scotland and TUI Group were the biggest detractors. Cybersecurity business Sophos Group was weak after the company warned on lower billings growth and slower customer acquisition. Discount retailer B&M saw its shares slide after a slower Q2 LFL performance. This was a result of being light on inventory due to selling out of key seasonal stock (garden future etc). On the flipside, stand-out positives were Wizz Air and Melrose.

On activity, we initiated a new position in retailer Next Group and sold our de-minimis holdings in media assets Pearson and WPP.

Gavin joined LGIM in 2007 and is a Fund Manager within the High Alpha team for Europe ex-UK portfolios. He joined LGIM from BlueBay Asset Management where he was a Global Equities Analyst. Gavin spent the majority of his buyside career as a Portfolio Manager with UBS O'Connor. Prior to this, he was a top-rated, sell-side analyst covering the Autos, Capital Goods and Conglomerates sectors at investment banks including SG Warburg (now part of UBS) and Goldman Sachs. Gavin holds a degree in Philosophy and Economics from University College, London.
