## FUND AIM

The objective of the Fund is to provide income and growth above those of the FTSE All Share TR Net Index, the "Benchmark Index". The Fund aims to outperform the Benchmark Index by 2% per annum. This objective is before the deduction of any charges and measured over rolling three year periods.

## RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

- **How does it invest?** Actively managed, with holdings in between 40 and 60 companies on average over a typical market cycle of 3-5 years.



## FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Continued positive market sentiment and broadening equity market participation drove a strong return for the UK equity market in April. The Covid-19 vaccine rollout in the UK has continued to proceed well, with 51% of the population now having received at least one dose, allowing for what looks like the start of a sustained reopening of the economy. It has been encouraging to see that Covid-19 cases remain at a low level, despite the relaxation of some restrictions. Optimism amongst investors was further fuelled by both the manufacturing and services PMI surveys coming in above 60 for April, indicating to economic growth in the UK. Beneath the headline index, the recent factor rotation trade from growth to value paused this month with growth outperforming. This was in contrast to February and March where inflation concerns and the reopening trade drove a strong value stock rally.

The L&G UK Equity Income Fund underperformed against its benchmark in April. Stock selection accounted for the underperformance, driven by our names in Financials and Industrials. Sector allocation was broadly neutral. By stock, top positive contributions came from our holdings in Future and Pagegroup. Not owning Royal Dutch Shell was also beneficial. Underperforming names included Direct Line Insurance, Whitbread and Dixons Carphone.

In terms of activity, we sold our position in easyJet. We see limited upside given the rising debt levels due to cash burn. We also sold our position in Future given the strong share price performance post the acquisition of GoCompare.

## ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE

### CARBON RESERVES

Carbon reserves are fossil fuels (coal, oil and gas) which, if burnt, will become the carbon emissions of the future. To meet global climate change targets, the unabated use of fossil fuels is expected to decline over time.

The figure is a measure of the size of carbon reserves held by the fund's underlying companies.

### CARBON EMISSIONS

Following the global Paris Agreement on climate change, companies in all sectors are expected to reduce their emissions to prepare and adapt for a low-carbon economy.

Carbon emissions intensity describes the relationship between the carbon emissions of a company and its sales<sup>ii</sup>.
