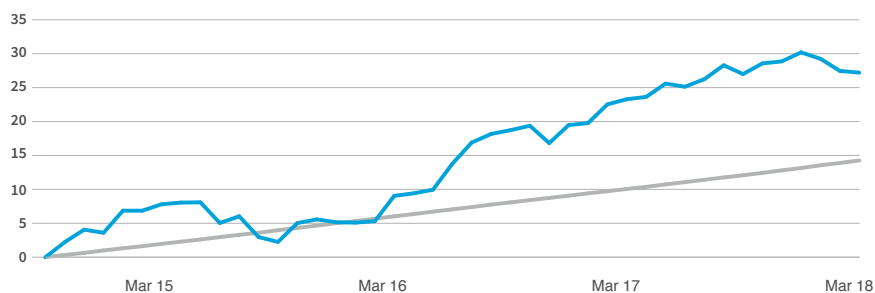
## WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

## FUND CHARACTERISTICS

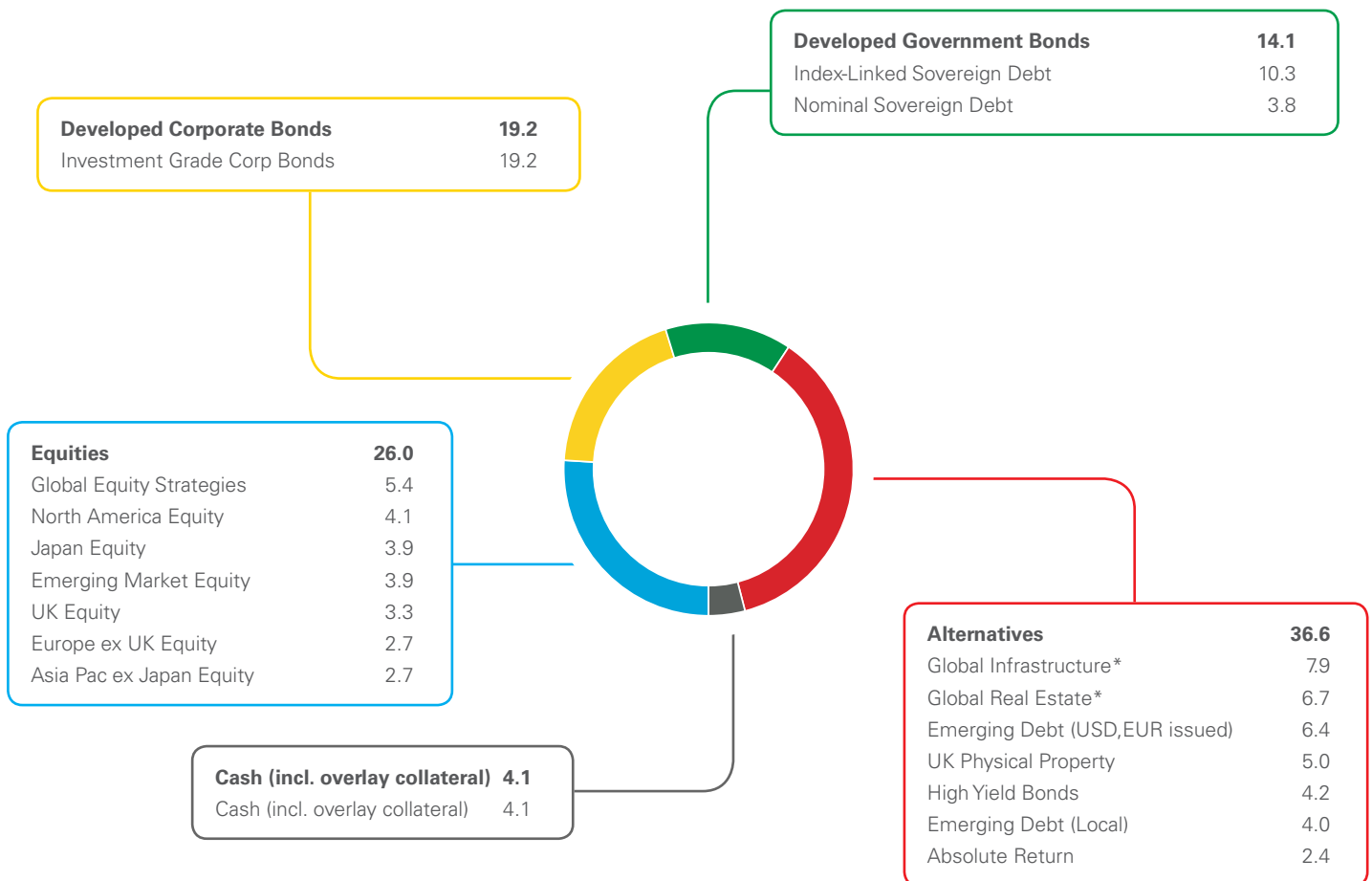
The fund provides exposure to a range of different asset classes that may include equities, bonds, property, commodities, and listed infrastructure, private equity and global real estate companies, which may be actively or passively managed. The asset allocation of the fund is managed by LGIM with the aim of enhancing returns and managing downside risk. The fund provides exposure to a combination of UK and overseas assets with a flexible approach to managing foreign currency exposure.

Derivatives may be used for efficient portfolio management.

### FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Equity markets began 2018 on the front foot, with global indices continuing to move higher in January. However, markets corrected sharply in February and March as concerns rose over rising bond yields and trade tensions between the United States and China. US 10-year yields rose by around 0.30%, with smaller increases seen in the UK and Europe. Meanwhile, investment grade and high yield spreads widened over the quarter.

The Retirement Income Multi-Asset Fund was down 2.3% over the quarter. This brings the total return since inception to 6.5% p.a. versus an objective of 3.9% p.a. The main negative contributions came from equity markets, listed alternatives and fixed income, including unhedged inflation-linked government bonds. However, this was partially offset by positive performance from currency hedges and equity option protection.

Prior to the weakness in equity markets we had introduced protection on US equities. Following the weakness in equity markets we increased exposure to equities across all regions and the US technology sector, as well as taking profits on our equity option protection. We continue to prefer equities and alternatives to corporate bonds. Prior to the weakness in February, we increased European exposure within corporate bonds (funded from US exposure). This helped mitigate the impact of the sell-off. We gradually increased nominal government bond exposure in late January and early February, reflecting the higher yields and excessive negative market sentiment. We also increased US TIPS exposure following weak performance.

### FUND MANAGERS

The Fund is managed by LGIM's Asset Allocation team. The team has a wealth of experience in fund management, investment strategy and economics. They are responsible for a wide range of multi-asset funds and investment strategies across LGIM's client base. The Fund allows a broad range of pension fund investors to access this expertise.

The day-to-day implementation of the allocation of the fund is managed by the Allocation Strategy Management team.
