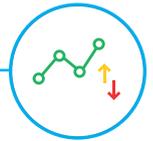



FUND AIM

The objective of the Fund is to provide income and growth above those of the FTSE World Europe ex-UK TR Net Index (the "Benchmark Index"). The Fund aims to outperform the Benchmark Index by 2% per annum. This objective is before the deduction of any charges and measured over rolling three year periods.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

The fund is in category 6 because it invests in company shares which are sensitive to variations in the stock market. The value of company shares can change substantially over short periods of time.





FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Positive market sentiment and broadening equity market participation drove a strong return for the European equity market in March. Both Germany and the Eurozone's manufacturing PMIs hit record highs in the month as demand rebounded. While the services sector continued to contract at Eurozone level, Germany's services sector returned to expansion in March. Market concern around inflation, reflected through rising bond yields, continued to be a key debate among investors. This, along with the reopening trade, continued the recent value stock rally, with the equity factor maintaining the recent outperformance over growth. The ECB addressed concerns over rising borrowing costs by committing to a ramp up in government bond purchases. Looking ahead, concerns remain on the EU lagging the rate of vaccine roll out in other developed regions such as the UK and US. Investors will continue to monitor Europe's progress closely.

The L&G European Equity Income fund marginally underperformed its benchmark in March. Stock selection accounted for the underperformance, mainly driven by our holding in Credit Suisse. The stock price dropped following news of their involvement with both Greensill and Archegos Capital. Sector allocation was broadly neutral. At the stock level, the top positive contributions came from our Basic Materials holdings, namely ArcelorMittal and Norsk Hydro. Underperforming names included Credit Suisse and Novo Nordisk.

In terms of new activity, we sold our position in Maersk. The share price hit new highs after strong rises in shipping rates, which we fear are not sustainable for the long term. We entered new positions in Essity, a personal goods company, and Galapagos, a small cap pharmaceutical company.

He joined from the in-house pension scheme at BAE Systems, where he was head of the European equities team, and a member of the asset allocation committee. Previously, he managed European equities for institutional and retail funds at Henderson Global Investors and HSBC Asset Management. He started his career at Phillips & Drew in 1992, where he spent 10 years investing in UK, European and Japanese Equities. He has an MA in PPE from New College, Oxford. Andrew is a CFA charterholder (since 1998) and an ASIP.

ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE

Carbon dioxide (CO₂) is the most significant contributor to greenhouse gas emissions which are driving climate change.

CARBON RESERVES

Carbon reserves are fossil fuels (coal, oil and gas) which, if burnt, will become the carbon emissions of the future. To meet global climate change targets, the unabated use of fossil fuels is expected to decline over time.

The figure is a measure of the size of carbon reserves held by the fund's underlying companies.

CARBON EMISSIONS

Following the global Paris Agreement on climate change, companies in all sectors are expected to reduce their emissions to prepare and adapt for a low-carbon economy.

Carbon emissions intensity describes the relationship between the carbon emissions of a company and its salesⁱⁱ.

ⁱ Carbon dioxide equivalent (CO₂e) is a standard unit to compare the emissions of different greenhouse gases.

ⁱⁱ The choice of this metric follows best practice recommendations from the **Task Force on Climate-related Financial Disclosures**.
