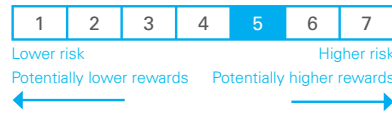

FUND AIM

The objective of this fund is to provide long-term growth to achieve a total return of both income and capital at 5% above the Bank of England base rate per annum over rolling three year periods. This objective is before the deduction of any charges and assumes any income is reinvested.

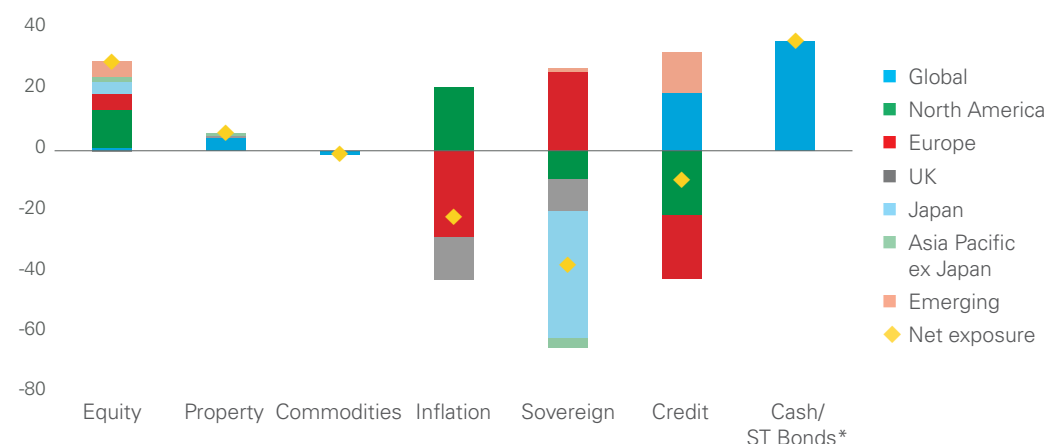

KEY RISKS

- The fund is a Targeted Absolute Return fund. This type of fund tries to increase the value of your investment over a period of time, in both rising and falling markets. However, there is no guarantee of returns. You may not get back the money you invest. Targeted Absolute Return funds use a range of different types of investment strategies and may use derivatives. It is possible that the value of these funds could go down when the market is rising, or may not rise as quickly.
- This fund holds bonds that, rather than being traded on an exchange, are traded through agents, brokers or investment banks matching buyers and sellers. This makes the bonds less easy to buy and sell than investments that are traded on an exchange and on any particular day there may not be a buyer or a seller for the bonds. In times of market uncertainty or if an exceptional amount of withdrawals are requested it may become less easy for your fund to sell investments and the Manager may defer withdrawals, or suspend dealing. The Manager can only delay paying out if it is in the interests of all investors and with the permission of the fund trustee or depository.
- The fund invests directly or indirectly in bonds which are issued by companies or governments.
