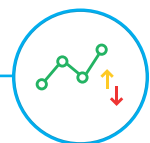


Legal & General UK Equity Income Fund

FUND AIM

The objective of this fund is to provide an income in excess of the yield represented by the performance of the FTSE All-Share Index, and long-term growth. The fund will typically invest between 80% and 100% in UK company shares, or in shares of overseas companies which have a significant part of their activities in the UK or whose shares are traded on UK stock markets.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

The fund is in category 5 because it invests in company shares which are sensitive to variations in the stock market. The value of company shares can change substantially over short periods of time.

FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

April proved to be a strong month for global equities as investor risk appetite recovered. Geopolitical fears receded, with the focus rotating back to corporate earnings. On economic data, Global PMI composites have firmly fallen from lofty levels, seemingly now heading towards a more measured pace. In the UK, the probability of a May interest rate hike plummeted after a disappointing first quarter GDP release which was accompanied by a fall in sterling.

Despite this, the FTSE All Share recorded its largest monthly rise since July 2013, closing April up by 6.4%. Sterling weakness boosted overseas earners and a steady stream of M&A stories also helped returns. This led to more evidence of a rotation in sector leadership.

Food retailers topped the list of winners, followed by oil & gas and telecoms. Conversely, consumer staples were led lower by tobacco and household goods. In terms of style tilts, stock rotation was in evidence, as value outperformed growth and quality. The underperformance of growth strategies largely reflects a period of weakness for internet and technology facing stocks (disruptors), while the lack of exposure to commodities also hurt relative returns.

The L&G UK Equity Income fund delivered 110bps relative outperformance in a strong market. This was predominantly led by strong returns in energy stocks, alongside good selection in retail, leisure and technology sectors. In general, our UK domestic exposure made a strong contribution. We also benefitted from our underweight in consumer staples.



STEPHEN MESSAGE
