

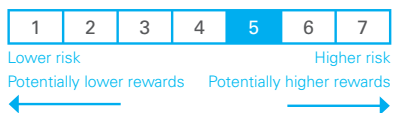

FUND AIM

The objective of the fund is to generate income in excess of the FTSE Europe ex-UK Index over rolling 3 year periods.

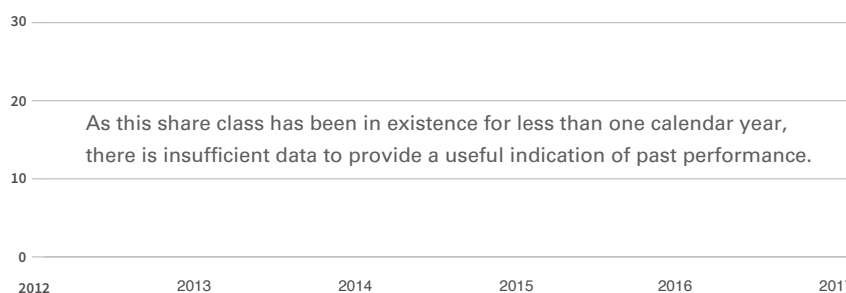

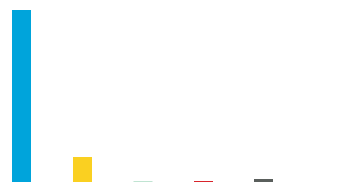

FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

Equity markets performed better in November, though investors remain relatively risk averse. Bottom-up newsflow began to recede on the completion of Q3 corporate earnings, meaning that market direction was once more in the hands of top-down drivers. Global growth indicators continue to imply an economic slowdown, while the response to comments from a less hawkish Fed and the Bank of England's post-Brexit scenarios were met with a degree of caution. Meanwhile, recent output and activity data in the Eurozone region disappointed the market as earnings season also failed to inspire.

European equity markets saw a modest decline in the period, falling -0.5% in total returns. Mid-caps were much weaker, while low beta names and some value sectors found support. In terms of outperformers, we saw telecoms, food retail and utilities top the winners list. On the flipside, resources, industrials and software industries fared poorly. Oil appears precariously poised, as prices fell heavily as the market awaits OPEC action to address global oversupply.

Turning to performance, the L&G European Equity Income fund fell -1.7%, which we consider disappointing given the positioning of the portfolio. Much of the relative weakness stemmed from selection in energy, personal goods and autos. Selection in banks was also disappointing. At the stock level, PGS, Pandora, ENI and Valeo detracted most value. On the flipside, we saw good gains in healthcare, led by Novo Nordisk and Genmab. Orange and Telefonica also made positive contributions.

On activity, there was no significant trading in the period.

Andrew joined LGIM in August 2014 and is a Fund Manager in the Global Income team. He joined from the in-house pension scheme at BAE Systems, where he was head of the European equities team, and a member of the asset allocation committee. Previously, he managed European equities for institutional and retail funds at Henderson Global Investors and HSBC Asset Management. He started his career at Phillips & Drew in 1992, where he spent 10 years investing in UK, European and Japanese Equities. He has an MA in PPE from New College, Oxford. Andrew is a CFA charterholder (since 1998) and an ASIP.
